Sikhula Sonke was extremely proud of the children who graduated from our Emthonjeni programme which reaches out to children not in preschool.

In 2019 several new preschool sites - with classrooms filled with all the resources a preschool needs, including ablutions, a kitchen, storeroom and more - were opened for our Emthonjeni children.

With lots of laughter and play, the children have learned much this year and have been deemed ready to enter formal primary schooling at local schools in Khayelitsha.

We wish these young learners a wonderful school career and pray that they will be prepared to one day enter the workplace as equipped and resourced (as well as resourceful) young adults.

# SOWING SEEDS OF SUCCESS THROUGH ECD PRACTITIONER TRAINING

Sikhula Sonke's Imbewu programme has supported more than 60 ECD practitioners in meeting the minimum standards for ECD Centres as defined by the Department of Social Development.

Sikhula Sonke also provides training to early childhood development practitioners, both for the principals of ECD Centres and for their assistants. The training is accredited with the South African government at NQF levels 4 and 2 respectively.

The Imbewu course runs for a full year and requires complete commitment from the students, with after-hours studying and afternoon lectures to mesh with the working hours of these busy teachers who meet the needs of the children in their schools in the mornings.

Sikhula Sonke is extremely proud of these Imbewu NQF Level 2 and 4 graduates! We know that you will put into practice all you have learnt and that your preschools and children will benefit greatly. Well done on your accomplishment this year.



### FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESK

As we sprint towards the end of year and everybody is looking forward to a well-deserved rest, it is a good time to reflect on the work done in 2019 and the fruits of that work. It is also important to finalise 2019 by preparing clear plans for 2020.

The Sikhula Sonke Early Childhood Development team had a full internal review of its programmes and recorded all the successes, setbacks and challenges not only in this quarter but over the past eleven months. This was not an easy year, as many organizations in the NPO sector can agree, but we are glad of what we have achieved and confident in the planning for Sikhula Sonke's future. We are especially grateful for the confidence that has been displayed by our partners and funding community. We therefore stand with confidence to serve the community of Khayelitsha - the children, parents, families, caregivers and educators.

We are very proud that Sikhula Sonke was nominated as finalists of the Community Chest Impumelelo Innovation Awards for Sikhula Sonke's Emthonjeni Outreach and Funda Udlale Toy Library programmes.

We were also thrilled that our Emthonjeni Outreach playgroup programme was also nominated for the MTN Awards for Social Change. Both of these nominations reveal a level of confidence in the work that we do and are a great motivation to our team.

Our learning programme delivery has shown great improvement

and achievement through the Early Learning Outcomes Measure assessment (ELOM), the results of which are available on request for our funding partners and our stakeholders.

We feel honored as a team to welcome some new staff members. Dumisani Samson is an experienced Social Worker who has put together a course on Mediation to assist families that we work with. Zintle Nose is our junior Social Worker who is mentored by Mr Samson; she has made a huge contribution in referring vulnerable children to various government Makhosazana Padi departments. recently joined us after a full year of volunteering; she is a very creative and dynamic lady who is an all rounder within the organization even though she is employed under Toy Library and Coaching programme. Wandisiwe Mzinyathi, a volunteer for one and a half years, is our new Toy Librarian and we love how creative she is in the Toy Library space. Nolubabalo Sijentu has been servicing Sikhula Sonke under the Extended Public Works programme for the past two years; we are glad to employ her in the First 1000 Days program which is run as part of our Imbiza Family Community Motivator (FCM) programme.

Amongst the highlights of the third and fourth quarter, Sikhula Sonke bought 130 kiddies chairs and 30 tables with a generous donation from **Surve Philanthropies**.

Three of our staff members attended a week-long International Toy Library Conference in Jo'burg with a large portion of the expenses covered by **Solon Foundation** and the rest by other funding partners.

A heartfelt and big thank you to all of our funding partners for their unique contribution in each of our programmes.

We would like to welcome our newest funding partners Philanthropy Initiative with Employees of Allan Gray (RF) NPC and The Oppenheimer Memorial Trust.

In closing, we would like to send our love, gratitude and deep appreciation to our individual donors, partners, grant-makers, funders, our donor friends of Sikhula community, Sonke, different stakeholders and governments for all the support, encouragement and faith in this organization that works in the extremely vulnerable communities of Khavelitsha.
